Topics include photography of crime scene and evidence, diagrams and field sketches, crime scene processing, trace evidence, bloodstain evidence, crime scene management, and fingerprint processing. Special emphasis to burglary, theft, fire and arson investigations, death and sexual assault investigations, impression evidence, macro photographic techniques, firearms, tool and bite marks, and report writing. Students must bring departmental camera, tripod, and flash.
